

BYLAW NO. 1/65

A Bylaw of the Village of Lucky Lake to provide for the establishing and regulating of a SCAVENGING SYSTEM.

The Council of the Village of lucky Lake enacts as follows:

- (1) The removal of household refuse in the Village of Lucky Lake shall be done by a person in the employ of the Council, or the Council may contract with one person to do such work, and except as hereinafter mentioned, no householder or other party shall remove or dispose of any refuse or garbage.
- (2) All household waste, whether consisting of animal or vegetable substance, and provided the same contains no liquid matter, shall be placed in a suitable covered receptacle provided by the householder and kept in a place convenient for removal by the authorized scavenger.
- (3) Garbage containers must be of metal construction with tight-fitting lids, and shall not exceed 17 gallons in volume.
- (4) All other receptacles not so designed shall be treated as rubbish and removed by the collectors.
- (5) Sufficient containers must be supplied to hold one week's collection.
- (6) All garbage should be drained of moisture and securely wrapped.
- (7) All combustible material must be burned in incinerators of approved design, and located to the approval of the Fire Chief.
- (8) Ashes shall not be placed in garbage containers.
- (9) All garbage containers shall be placed on stands of approved design as described on schedule 1 of this bylaw.
- (10) If the householder, after receiving notice from the Village to provide a proper garbage receptacle, neglects to do so, the Council may provide such receptacle at the expense of the householder.
- (11) All slops and liquids, after straining and retaining of solid substances must be disposed of as follows: During the summer months spread over an area of spaded ground on the back of the lot kept in a sanitary condition. In winter discharged within a cribbed area of suitable size (the cribbing to be of wood six inches deep) to prevent spreading. As liquids will freeze, the mass must be picked up prior to spring thaw and removed to the waste disposal grounds. (This section does not apply to residents having connections to Village water and sewer system.)
- (12) The proprietor or management of any places of business where large volumes of slops and wash water are created and which are located where Village water and sewer services are not available, must provide water tight tanks or chambers to contain all liquid wastes; such waste must be removed when necessary to the waste disposal grounds.
- (13) Trade refuse, such as loose papers, paper boxes, straw, or other packings must be kept in boxes or tied into bundles ready to be removed by the scavenger.
- (14) The waste disposal grounds provided by the Village is the only authorized place for deposit and disposal of any filth or refuse created in the Village and any one found guilty of dumping elsewhere anything directly or indirectly noxious, offensive, or dangerous to health, shall be guilty of an offense.

(15) If any person fails, neglects, or refuses to do anything which he is required to do by this bylaw, such thing may be done by the Council at the expense of the person in default and the Village may recover the expense thereof with costs by action in any court of competent jurisdiction or in like manner as municipal taxes.

(16) Any person found guilty of an infraction of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the general penalty bylaw of the Village of Lucky Lake.

(17) This bylaw shall come into force on the day it is approved by the Minister of Public Health, Province of Saskatchewan.
