# BYLAW NO 2-83

### Village of Lucky Lake

A Bylaw of the Village of Lucky Lake to provide for the closing of the lane lying between the productions Northerly of the East and West limits of Block nine (9) as shown on Registered Plan Number CH1967 in the Village of Lucky Lake.

Whereas the Village of Lucky Lake is desirous of closing the lane northerly of the East and West limits of Block nine (9) as shown on Registered Plan Number CH1967 in the Village of Lucky Lake in order to effect a resubdivision of an adjacent area, and that no adjacent owners are adversely affected.

And whereas the Sask. Power Corporation has consented to such closure by letter dated the 24th day of January, 1983

And whereas the Saskatchewan Telecommunications has consented to such closure by letter dated January 18th, 1983

And whereas the Deputy Minister of Highways has consented to such closure by letter dated January 10th, 1983

And whereas notice of intention to pass this Bylaw has been delivered personally to H.J.D. Farms Ltd. and Harvey Rusnell who are the Registered and Assessed owners of land abutting upon the lane north of Block nine (9) proposed to be closed,

And whereas no petition against the proposed closing of the lane north of Block nine (9) has been received by the Village,

 ${\sf NOW}$  therefore the Council of the Village of Lucky Lake in open meeting assembled enacts as follows.

- 1. That the lane lying between the productions Northerly of the East and West limits of Block nine (9) as shown on Registered Plan Number CH1967 in the Village of Lucky Lake be closed in order to effect a resubdivision of an adjacent area.
- 2. That Title of the said portion of the lane lying north of Block Nine (9) so closed shall vest in favor of H.J.D.Farms Ltd.
- 3. This Bylaw shall come into force and take. effect on, from and after the final passing thereof.
- 4. That Bylaw NO 1-83 is hereby repealed.

Introduced and read the first time this 14th day of March 1983. Read a second time this 14th day of March 1983.

AN AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE MUNICIPALITIES

COMPRISING THE WHEATLAND REGIONAL LIBRARY

Effective from 1 January, 1984 to 31 December, 1986

AGREEMENT made between the municipalities comprising the WHEATLAND REGIONAL LIBRARY.

WHEREAS the Public Libraries Act, being Chapter 45 of the Revised Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1969, provides that any municipality may by Bylaw associate with any other municipality or municipalities in the establishment and operation of a Regional Library and may grant money for the establishment and make an annual grant for the maintenance of the library;

AND WHEREAS municipalities have, by agreement, associated themselves in the establishment and the operation of such a Regional Library under the name of the Wheatland Regional Library, suject to the covenants, undertakings and conditions hereinafter set forth;

AND WHEREAS the council of the municipalities of libraries Act, passed a bylaw approving the association of the municipality, under the covenants, undertakings and conditions of this agreement, in the establishment and operation of the Wheatland Regional Library with the municipalities and with any other municipality which executes under seal a like agreement and which is approved as an associated municipality by the Regional Library Board hereinafter constituted;

of <u>llage of fuch, hake</u> hereby agrees to associate itself with the other associated municipalities in the operation of a Regional Public Library pursuant to The Public Libraries Act, Revised Statutes of Saskatchewan, Chapter 45, 1969, and the regulations made thereunder and upon the following covenants, undertakings, and conditions:

1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of the Regional Library shall be to provide public library service for the people within the boundaries of the associated municipalities;

- 2. Term. Subject to the provision for the disassociation in clause 3, the term of this agreement shall be from the 1st January, 1984, to the 31st December, 1986, at which time, if no notice has been given the term shall be renewable automatically for subsequent periods of three years;
- 3. Disassociation. (1) Insofar as it complies with the terms of withdrawal prescribed by the regulations, any associated municipality may disassociate itself from the other associated municipalities in the establishment and operation of the Regional Library by giving the secretary of the Regional Library two (2) years' notice in writing of the proposed withdrawal, as outlined in Section 53 of the Public Libraries Act; it is understood that the associated municipality, when serving two (2) years' notice of withdrawal, will continue to be responsible for the annual levy until the end of the two (2) years' notice;
- (2) Disassociation shall be upon such terms as may be determined by Section 10 of the Regulations under the Public Libraries Act, Chapter 45, RSS, 1969;
- 4. Board. The general management, control and operation of the Regional Library shall be under the supervision and direction of a Regional Library Board, hereinafter called "the Board", constituted and with the powers, duties and responsiblilities as set out in the Public Libraries Act and regulations thereunder;
- 5. Meetings and Quorum. (1) The Board shall meet at least twice a year and at such other times as it deems advisable;
- (2) An annual meeting of the Board shall be held before April 30th of each year;
  - (3) At all meetings of the
- Board, 42 members present shall form a quorum;
- 6. Executive. The Executive Board shall be elected from and by the Regional Board members, at the spring meeting each year, as prescribed in Section 56 of the Public Libraries Act;

- 7. <u>Table Officers</u>. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected by the Executive Board at the first meeting after the annual Spring Board meeting.
- 8. <u>Central Branch</u>. The Central Branch of the Regional Library shall be in the city of Saskatoon in such space and upon such terms as may be agreed upon by the Board;
- 9. Housing of Books. (1) Where a branch is requested by a municipality or combination of municipalities, and the request is approved by the Executive Board, the accommodation provided by each municipality, in accordance with the regulations for the care, housing and distribution of books shall be bright, attractive, well lit, well heated, well kept and shall
  - (a) include space for browsing and study
  - (b) be located on a ground floor
  - (c) include well secured space for the storage of books and related material
  - (d) be located near the centre of the town, village or hamlet;
  - (e) comply with the Branch standards set by the Executive Board.

association of municipalities requests a Mobile Branch stop, and the request is approved by the Board, accommodation provided by the municipality (ies) shall include the provision of an electrical outlet satisfactory to the Wheatland requirements and the provision of a book return box in a designated location, if requested by the Central Branch;

10. Finance. (1) The Regional Library shall be financed by grants from the Provincial Government and by payments made by each of the associated municipalities, which payments shall be: 1984 - \$2.60

1985 - an increase equal to not more than 1% below the Saskatchewan rate of inflation, calculated to October 31, 1984.

1986 - an increase equal to not more than 1% below the rate of Saskatchewan inflation, calculated to October 31, 1985.

- Any associated municipality may if it so desires agree with the Board to increase the amount of its payment, as determined above, in consideration for increased services;
- (3) Payments of the associated municipalities shall be made on a semi-annual basis, one half before January 15th, and the other half before July 15th of each year; municipalities may, however, pay the entire levy at the beginning of each year;
- Additional Members. Any municipality may become an associated municipality upon executing under seal an agreement in the same covenants, undertakings and conditions as are herein contained, provided its application is approved by the Board.
